 107 Main St	Your Home Library - 1885 and 1920 - T.I. Lacey, architect, designed the 1885 brick Queen Anne residence. The house has a hipped and gabled roof with gabled dormers. A tower, with an octagonal roof, is centered on the facade. The house was purchased by Endicott-Johnson Company in 1917 and converted into a public library to serve the community. The sun porch was added soon after the building was purchased and the large, two-story, brick rear addition was designed in 1919 and constructed in 1922.  110 Main St	This is a two-story, American Foursquare with a hipped roof and hipped dormers. The first story is brick; the second is sided with aluminum. A gabled porch spans the facade. There are Ionic columns supporting the arch in each opening of the bell towers. Between the columns are curved stone balustrades. Dentils and egg and dart moldings decorate the cornice. Modillions support the wide eaves. Doric columns are used at the entrances and the classical moldings are repeated along the entablature. Most windows are 6/1 and some are paired. The hipped roofed, brick entry porch is centered on the facade. Glass block windows enclosed the porch on the east and west sides. The paneled front door is flanked by sidelights. There is a two-story, three-bay garage with a flat roof behind the house. 

 222 Main St	This structure is actually twin buildings combined. They are the 1921 Hancock Block (east) and the 1922 Hancock Block (west). The buildings are tile with brick veneer fronts. The storefront of the 1921 buildings has been removed and replaced with modern display windows.  314 Main St	314 Main Street – Sarah Jane Johnson Methodist Church - 1927 - The Gothic Revival church was built of Hummelstown brownstone, quarried at Hummelstown, Pa. The three-stage tower, 112 feet high, has an open belfry. In 1946 Carillon Bells, purchased in memory of those who served in the Armed Forces in World War II, were added to the tower. The main entrance to the church is located at the base of the tower. The church has a gabled roof with the gable end facing Main Street. A large central Gothic window dominates the Main Street facade. Pointed Gothic windows are placed between the buttresses on the side walls.
